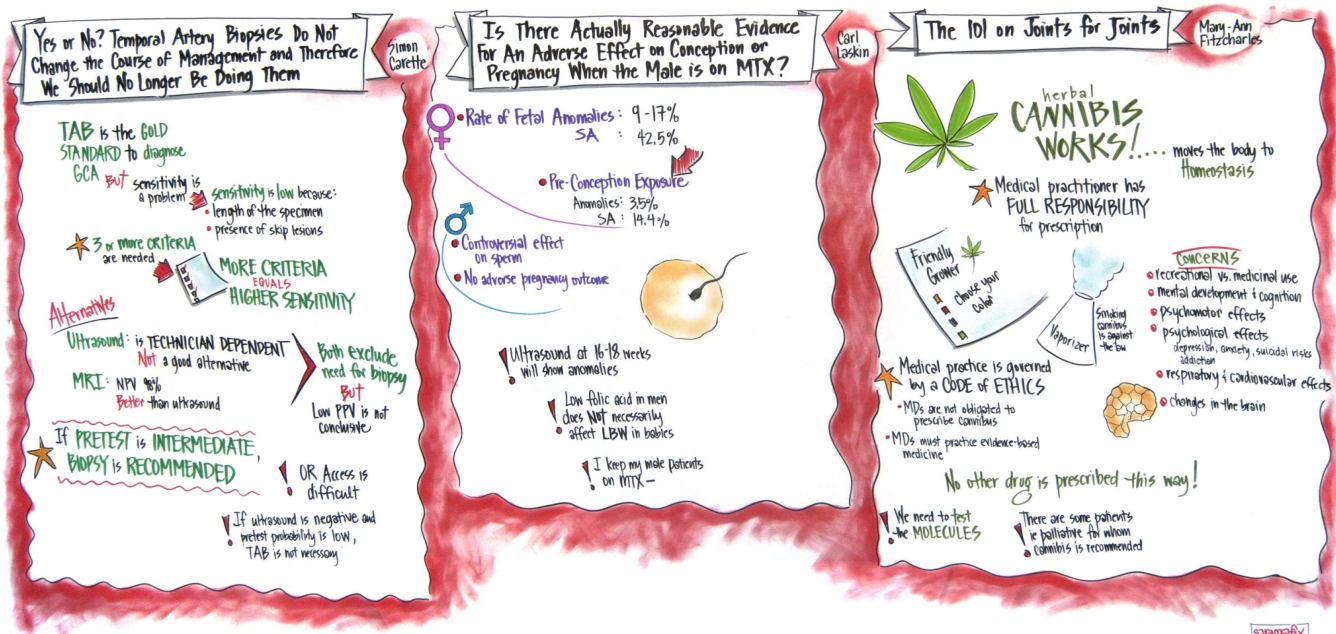
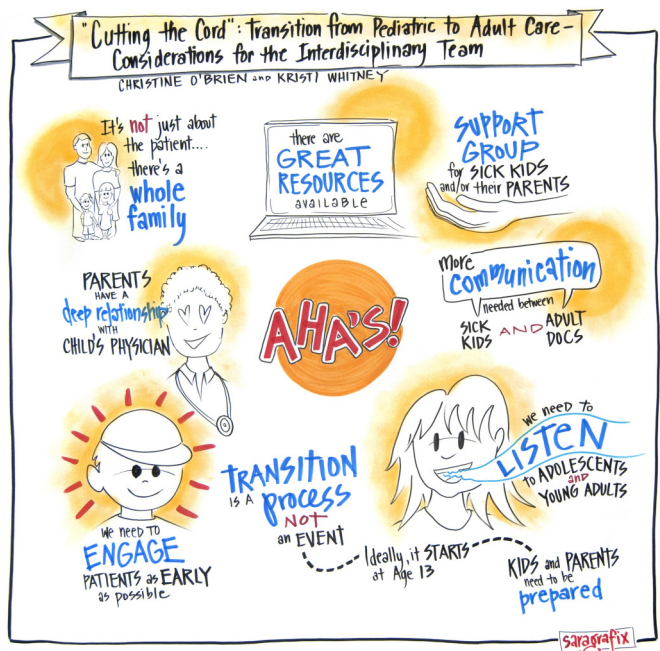


# WHAT'S THE CRA DOING FOR YOU?
